A retrospective by one of the world's foremost abstractionists. Since the 1960's, painter and multi-media artist Siri Berg, has worked with a geometric abstraction, one both strictly reduced and rich in variation and the visually unexpected. The exhibition provides an exclusive access to a selection of Berg's vintage and new paintings, offering a different investigative look at the varied interests and aesthetic experimentations of Berg's career. Siri Berg was born in Stockholm, Sweden, in 1921. Curated by: Peter Hionas.
